With over sixteen years of proven success as Chancellor, I have elevated PSNK's educational reputation and implemented strategic initiatives that drive innovative academic and community engagement opportunities. Highlights include:

• Culture of Innovation and Collaboration

Cultivated a campus culture of creativity and cooperative work, resulting in an enhanced standing for PSNK within Penn State and the wider region.

GREAT Program for Engineering Students

Launched the "Growing Regional Excellence through Experience, Academics, and Training" (GREAT) program, linking first-year engineering students with local employers. This ongoing program has increased retention and job placement rates by fostering long-term industry connections for students.

ABC/Create STEM Collaboration

Built ABC/Create, a STEM-focused partnership with 14 regional school districts, now in its eleventh year, equipping K–12 students with future-ready skills through hands-on learning.

Westmoreland Economic Development Initiative for Growth (WEDIG)

Founded WEDIG to unite five municipal leaders for regional economic progress, achieving nearly a decade of impact through public-private collaboration.

Nextovation[™] Initiative for Rust Belt Revitalization

Conceived and implemented Nextovation™, a model for economic revitalization that has directly raised over \$20 million and leveraged \$40 million in external funds, bringing together stakeholders from business, government, foundations, and education sectors. Key achievements include:

- Corner Launchbox: A \$1 million co-working and entrepreneurial facility in downtown New Kensington, generating over \$120 million in new investments and establishing 100+ new businesses.
- Digital Foundry: A \$16 million, fully externally funded facility providing access to cutting-edge Industry 4.0 technologies for skill-building across southwest Pennsylvania's manufacturing sector.
- Corridor of Innovation: Designated by the city mayor, this initiative transformed
 New Kensington's downtown, enhancing foot traffic and attracting research-focused
 businesses, with substantial involvement from PSNK students and faculty.
- Faculty Academy: Designed a faculty academy to help faculty adjust to the effects of the Digital Age. This initiative attracted \$1.2 million in funding to help faculty across disciplines and across the 29 universities and colleges in Southwest PA become aware of cutting-edge technology, determine it will impact students pursuing careers in their disciplines, and integrate those findings into their curricula.

Fundraising and Scholarship Success

Exceeded goals in two major fundraising campaigns, with the most recent campaign reaching 265% over target. The funds directly supported scholarships and new programming, with annual giving now surpassing prior campaign totals.

• Strategic Enrollment and Recruitment Initiatives

Expanded recruitment in diverse markets, leading to a 7% increase in new student enrollment for Fall 2024 and an 18% rise in applications for Fall 2025. These efforts strengthened PSNK's position as one of the few Pennsylvania campuses to experience growth amid regional declines.

As Chancellor, I oversee all aspects of campus operations, including strategic visioning, academic programming, budget planning, enrollment strategy, community engagement, and fundraising. I also represent PSNK within university leadership, serving on the Academic Leadership Committee and Commonwealth Chancellors Council, and act as a liaison to community and state organizations.



Overview: Since assuming the Chancellorship at PSNK, I have presented in hundreds of venues, from Rotary clubs to corporate board rooms, university campuses, k-12 education meetings, conferences, seminars and more. I am frequently interviewed and quoted in various publications, podcasts, and in local television shows. As the Chancellor of a campus with limited resources that needed to transform not only itself on multiple fronts but also a region, my creative energy as an educator over the past 15 years has been spent researching challenges needing to be overcome in order to move the city, region, and university campus toward revitalization. The accompanying

graphic contains the ingredients of the Nextovation[™] project we are implementing in New Kensington. I researched, conceived, designed, and pitched each of the major concepts. These took months and/or years of gathering input, writing white papers, and presenting to groups across the region and state in multiple venues in order to gain adhesion. As the concepts gained shape, traction, and funding, staff began applying their talents to



refining and implementing the initiative, enabling me to move to the next challenge. While I have stopped committing to paid consulting opportunities, I typically spend three to five hours per week advising others on issues related to economic development, community engagement, futurereadiness, Industry 4.0, as well as on the concepts outlined in the Nextovation™ graphic.
